Women's Circle/LWML — Bev Wischnofske — Women's Circle has hosted the 34th Annual Advent Brunch, organized the Progressive Dinner, provided cookies and coffee for each of the Advent Services; currently planning a luncheon for the Circuit Pastor's Conference on Saturday, January 28th; the Potato Bar is set for Sunday, February 12th; the Hydro Park in East Wenatchee has been reserved for the Congregational Picnic on Sunday, July 22nd; donations were made to the LWML Scholarship Fund, confirmation retreat expenses, and the new family facility — Hospitality Heights — which is associated with Hospitality House.

Altar Guild — Marilyn Delzer — Altar Guild has been very busy with all the Worship Service preparations during the holidays; Lenten Services will be starting soon.

Preschool — Laura Rosentrater — the school year is half over, with 39 children attending; there was a great turnout for the Christmas Program, with approximately 190 + 36 children; thank you to all for setting up, being there, and helping clean up; they are helping with food and clothing for the Lighthouse Mission; preschool families attended the Epiphany service and will be invited to the Easter Sunday service; we have a great opportunity to share with these families; registration for this fall's classes will begin on March 1st; a thank you to Sandy for being so welcoming as parents come in to visit; thank you to everyone for the continued support of the Preschool and for the Thrivent Dollars. The Voter's Assembly gave a THANK YOU to Laura for all the work she does with the Preschool.

Tabitha — Barb Miller — After a three-week rest in December, Tabitha is back at work making quilts and putting together school kits and health kits for Lutheran World Relief; hoping to send 150 school kits, but still need more rulers; quilts will go to LWR, YWCA women's shelter, and smaller Comfort Care quilts to Vancouver, WA, also homeless and fire victims in our area. A quilt is being made for a raffle to help fund the choir robes. The scale for weighing the quilt boxes for shipping has been moved to a more accessible area. PLEASE DO NOT USE THIS SCALE. The extra worship service overflow chairs that were stored in the Tabitha area have been moved to the left front corner of the former altar area.

Landscaping — Merle Wischnofske — planning for the spring planting, with 25 plants total; filling in bare spots and adding beauty to areas; a fir tree will be planted.

Coordinating Committee — Carl Ericksen — members are encouraged to communicate with the church office regarding upcoming events; there was a lengthy discussion re: Natural Church Development, reviewing the Constitution/ByLaws/ Procedures; rewrites and changes to be presented at next Voter's Meeting in April; the goal is to build more efficient structures through these documents, adding on to the foundation that has been laid previously to enable all to *Serve the Lord with Gladness*

M.O.P.S. — A THANK YOU to Donaji Maydole, Bonnie Langford, and Debbie Johnson for their work in reviving the program; attendance is approximately 15 for each meeting; a THANK YOU to Jack Smith for coordinating the Mopetts workers, to Kathryn Barger for keeping the nursery picked up and clean; a M.O.P.S Sunday with a bake sale is being planned.

Aesthetics — Bev Wischnofske — new banners have been hung on the large wall by the secretary's office door; the picture grouping above the coffee bar is complete.

Endowment — Bev Wischnofske — the annual report will be given at the next Voter's meeting after the year-end information has been received.

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS — the semi-annual distribution of funds will be made after approval of recommendations at the next Voter's meeting; boards, committees, and organizations that have requests for these funds can submit their information by mid-March to Bev Wischnofske and representatives of each group will meet to determine the distribution portions.

**Voter’s Assembly
January 8, 2012**

The Voter’s Assembly convened at 12:05 p.m. President Carl Ericksen presided. Twenty-five members were present. Pastor led the devotion, based on Isaiah 60:1-3“...but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.....”

Minutes – The minutes from the October 9, 2011, Voter’s Assembly were reviewed. The minutes are to stand, as is, and **approved**. There was a clarification regarding the offerings for the Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve, and New Year’s Eve Service offerings. These will go to the mission in the Dominican Republic where Danelle Putman serves. There was also a clarification regarding the 63rd LCMS NW District Convention – there will be no Youth Delegate.

Pastor’s Report – Pastor reported on his work since October 9, 2011, and also a thank you for the gifts, prayers, and partnership in the Gospel. He will be taking the Junior Confirmation students on a retreat January 20-22, at Lutherhaven on Lake Coeur d’Alene in Idaho.

Elders – Norm Reid – the Elders have been working together with Pastor Mick in making hospital visits, home visits, visiting shut-ins, making minor home repairs as requested. Attendance at Prayer Vigils has been less than last year, with an average of 1-6 people. Wes Visser will preach on January 22, as Pastor will be at the confirmand retreat. Sandy Larsen will be needing time off in the next month or so, and we need to have a person trained to run the computer and printer during those times.

Financial Secretary – Jerry Tangren – Jerry reported that the overall giving is down from 2010.

Treasurer – Tom Oelke presented the monthly reports for **OCTOBER, NOVEMBER, & DECEMBER 2011**. Regular Book Balance as of **10-31-11** is \$6,332.69, Special Book Balance \$1,620.90, Total Book Balance \$7,953.59; *Building Fund Book Balance* \$19,307.84.

Regular Book Balance as of **11-30-11** is \$16,271.06, Special Book Balance \$1,604.70, Total Book Balance \$17,875.76, *Building Fund Book Balance* \$13,278.64.

Regular Book Balance as of **12-31-11** is \$8,420.02, Special Book Balance \$2,433.27, Total Book Balance \$10,853.29, *Building Fund Book Balance* \$22,248.66.

The Lutheran Church Extension Fund loan balance is \$843,710.15 at present.

The offerings for the mission in the Dominican Republic where Danelle Putman serves: Thanksgiving Day \$1,116.00, Christmas Eve \$1,159.00, Special Donation \$300.00, and New Year’s Eve \$824.00, for a total of \$3,399.00.

Tom reported that we are starting the New Year with a low balance in the bank. We have three months to cover the mortgage. What approach do we need to bring in extra funds? In 2013 we will need approximately \$30,000 for the widening of Eastmont Avenue project. The average for outgoing bills is \$12,000 – \$14,000 per month. We all need to be more conservative on the spending from the budget. We are current at the present time with the Building Fund.

Stewardship – Carol Trunzo – no report

Evangelism — Eva Williams – New member packets were given to families who recently joined the congregation – Cindy Austin, Mariah Morris, Cara Lara, and Sara Eskew; the Christmas mitten, scarf, hat, and sock tree items were given to the Lighthouse ministries; “Faith Comes by Hearing” is a Christian DVD given to servicemen at their request by their chaplain – is this a ministry opportunity that Faith would like to pursue? The second session of “Tracking the Spirit” with the Denneys will be held February 3 & 4; the project with Sunday School children and adult prayer partners is progressing.

Education – Eric Loeb sack – The Children’s Christmas Program, written and directed by Christine Charlton, was great. All the practices during this time are important and critical to the formation of a Christian education. Each year Faith Lutheran Church establishes the relationship of Christmas with the birth of Jesus, the SON OF GOD, with this program. Using the “Growing in Christ” curriculum leading up to Easter establishes the relationship between Easter and Jesus’ role in our salvation. Faith is blessed with staff and with the Holy Spirit. Praise and thanks were given to Joe Trowbridge and Pastor for all their time given to the Midweek/Faith Builders program.

Youth – Ron Colwell– November - the youth provided a Thanksgiving meal for two families; December – Thrivent provided funds to help a family with five children with gifts and a meal. The youth shopped for the gifts. The family was very appreciative. Youth also helped with the Epiphany Christmas Tree Burning on January 6th.

Trustees – Stan Delzer – the City of East Wenatchee/Eastmont Avenue project is scheduled for summer of 2013, with a new sidewalk and retaining wall; the Trustees are looking into buying two walk-off rugs for the sanctuary door and office area door; lawn area in NE corner of parking lot will be complete by spring; water-damaged ceiling tiles in narthex will be replaced; the changeable lights project behind the cross in the sanctuary will be completed. ALL projects are completed in regard to the remodeling of the church.

The Stewardship Corner

“Money affects every aspect of our lives. It is one of the acid tests of character ,and so it is not surprising that scripture has a lot to say about it. Did you know that there are over 2,300 verses in the Bible that deal with our possessions?

Jesus knew how important it was to talk about, since two-thirds of his parables address the topic. Why is money and our possessions such an issue for God? The way we handle our money doesn’t just affect us in our pocketbook, it affects us spiritually. How we handle our money affects our relationship with the Lord.

These scripture passages highlight four principles:

1. God is the owner of everything.
2. We are to be generous with the treasure entrusted to us.
3. We are to prudently manage our treasure.
4. Our treasure can be dangerous if not handled responsibly before God.

The first and foundational principle is that God is the source of everything. He owns it all. We are his managers. We really own absolutely nothing in God’s eyes. Every cent, every possession is God’s. This is quite contrary to the “me” culture that teaches us to think this is my house, my car, my bank account. Recognizing God’s ownership of all things is critical in allowing Him to become Lord of our money and our possessions. This may seem limiting, but it is really liberating.

Strange as it seems, money and possessions, which should be among the blessings of life, have tied more people in knots, caused more failed marriages, and sent more people to the psychiatrist than we’ll ever know. This is largely because many people live by their pocketbook and try to fulfill their lives with things, finding it easy to act as if God doesn’t exist in this area of their lives. Slowly the mindset can develop that, “I worked hard for what I have, and it’s mine to do as I choose.” We cannot own something without it owning us. We lose joy and a sense of freedom if we try to play God. He owns. We manage. When we pursue the created instead of the Creator, we create our own materialistic god.

Giving a meaningful percentage of one’s income is a step in the right direction. Why? Because it helps a person to develop a right perspective that all our money, ability, our very lives, belong to God. These are trusts from God to be used as He would have them used. It frees us from faithless fear and results in an indescribable freedom that can never come to those who think they must do everything for themselves.” Quoted from the “Barnabas Foundation”.

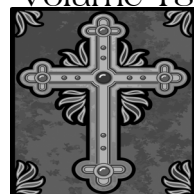
